An emergency situation can happen at any time. Your best defense is to be prepared by knowing what to do in an emergency.

Employees should all know:

Where the nearest evacuation route is

- Where to go once they have evacuated the building
- Who the fire wardens are
- What the emergency alarms sound like
- Where fire alarm pull stations are located
- Where fire extinguishers are located
- Who has been trained to use a fire extinguisher
- Where the nearest first aid kit is located
- Who has been trained in first aid

PROCEDURE

- 1. Sound the school fire alarm when the fire is discovered.
- 2. Teacher and students will evacuate the building following evacuation routes.
- 3. Teachers and students will go to their designated area and take roll call.
- 4. Any missing students should be reported immediately to administration.
- Call 911.
- Do not re-enter the school building until instructed to do so by fire fighters.
- 7. Staff is to remain with students until the situation has been remedied.
- If the school building cannot be entered within a reasonable time, send students and staff
 to the emergency Evacuation Site, if applicable. If transportation is required contact the
 Manager of Facilities & Transportation.
- 9. Notify the Superintendent of schools (division specific).
